Since June 2002, Lebanon has become one of nine Mediterranean countries covered by Tempus, the inter-university cooperation programme set up by the European Commission to help in the reform and development process in the sector of higher education.

Starting in 1990 for Eastern and Central Europe, Tempus was then gradually extended to the Balkans and South East Asia before being further extended to the MEDA region.

This last extension of Tempus programme came in the framework of the Barcelona Declaration of 1995 which laid the foundation for a Euro-Mediterranean Partnership. One of the key objectives of this Declaration is to "Develop human resources, promote understanding between cultures and rapprochement of the peoples in the Euro-Mediterranean region as well as to develop free and flourishing civil societies (social, cultural and human partnership)".

As for Lebanon in particular, the programme was also highlighted by the Association Agreement between the European Community and Lebanon aiming at:

- Providing an appropriate framework for political dialogue between the parties and at all levels.
- Gradually establishing a free trade area.
- Promoting economic, social, cultural and monetary cooperation as well as cooperation in other areas which are of mutual interest.

At a time when Lebanon is witnessing an expansion of its higher education system, problems like restructuring, benchmarking, introducing of new technologies and of new teaching methodologies, compatibility with regional and international trends, the lack of a national strategy for higher education, arise and create new challenges to both public and private sectors. Tempus provides higher education institutions with real opportunities to tackle these problems through a cooperation scheme involving partners from the European Union. Despite the fact that openness to the international trends is not new in all Lebanese ways of life, particularly in education, the challenges that Lebanese higher education institutions are faced with, in an era of globalization, are so great that these institutions cannot succeed by themselves. They need help and that is what Tempus for...

TEMPUS ACTIVITIES

JEP

Joint European Project

The main core of Tempus activities.

Areas of interest:

- * Curriculum Development
- * University Management
- * Training Courses for "Institution Building"

Consortium needed:

A minimum of 1 higher education institution from Lebanon, and two partners from two different European member states, one of them should be a university.

Deadline:

15 December of each year.

Duration:

2 or 3 years.

Budget:

Up to 500 000 for a 3-year project and up to 300 000 for a 2-year project.

Priorities:

National priorities are pre-defined by The Lebanese educative authorities and will be taken into consideration at the selection process.

SCM

Structural and Complementary Measures

For short-term responses and reform needs at national level.

Areas of interest:

- * National reform.
- * Development of a specific aspect of higher education.
- * Dissemination of results targeting Tempus objectives.

Consortium needed:

A minimum of 1 higher education institution from Lebanon, and 2 partners from 2 different member states, one of them should be a university.

Deadlines:

15 Februray and 15 October of each year.

Duration:

Up to one year.

Budget:

Up to 150 000 for Structural Measures and up to 100 000 for Complementary Measures.

Priorities:

National priorities are pre-defined by the Lebanese educative authorities and the projects should be aligned with these priorities.

Individual Mobility Grant

Intended to help individuals to carry out missions for a limited period of time aiming at :

- * Preparing a JEP proposal.
- * Participating in a specific event.
- * Retraining period or study period, collaboration on a specific academic subject, dissemination of good practice.

Deadlines:

15 February, 15 June and 15 October of each year.

Duration:

Missions can last up to 8 weeks.

An individual mobility grant covers the travel and the cost of stay during the designated mission but not the fees or any other kind of subscription.

A successful applicant has to skip two following deadlines in order to be eligible for a next mobility grant.



An important over-arching priority for Higher Education in Lebanon is to put in place a homogeneous evaluation system across the higher education institutions, and to develop a "culture" and a "system" for quality assurance.

Joint European Projects

Joint European projects will be oriented towards restructuring curricula in accordance with regional and international trends, in particular with a view to the new European LMD system. Academic content will be developed towards a credit system to ensure mobility and recognition at national, regional and international level with a focus on developing new teaching methodologies and techniques.

The following priorities apply:

Curriculum Development

- Environmental sciences
- Public health
- Tourism
- Inter-cultural studies
- Promoting the development of doctoral programmes

University Management

- Strengthening of management capacities in the fields of administration and finance.
- Creation of internal quality assurance mechanisms.

Training Courses for Institution Building

No specific priorities.

Structural and Complementary Measures

Structural and Complementary Measures should focus on developing a national strategy on higher education in Lebanon, to which higher education institutions can align their educational and administrative policies.

- Student mobility and mutual recognition of diplomas among different co-existing education systems in Lebanon.
- Benchmarking for higher education.

Joint European Projects

Since June 2002, Lebanon has benefited from 10 JEPs (5 from the selection of 2002 which started running last year and 5 from the selection of 2003 which would start their activities from the academic year 2004-2005). 4 of these projects involve Lebanon as an only beneficiary country, while the other 6 involve Lebanon as a partner country.

The deadline for the JEPs of 2004 is as of next 15 December and the selction will be finalized by june 2005.

Individual Mobility Grants

Among all activities financed by Tempus, these are the most popular. Without counting the outcome of the Octobre 2004 round of selection, 78 IMGs have so far been offered to finance missions carried out by lebanese academics in Europe or by European academics in Lebanon. The repartition of those grants between the Lebanese higher education institutions is as follows: Lebanese University 55, Balamand 5, USEK 4, Saint Joseph 4, LAU 3, NDU 2, IUL 2, AUB 1, BIU 1, MECAT 1.

Erasmus Mundus

Erasmus Mundus is a five year (2004-2008) co-operation and mobility programme in the field of higher education with a planned financial envelope of 230 million Euro. It will support about 100 Masters Courses of outstanding academic quality. The programme will also provide grants for some 5,000 graduate students from third countries to follow these Masters Courses, and for more than 4,000 EU graduate students involved in these courses to study in third countries. The programme will also offer teaching or research scholarships in Europe for over 1,000 incoming third-country academics and for a similar number of outgoing EU scholars. Last but not least, Erasmus Mundus will support about 100 partnerships between Erasmus Mundus Masters Courses and higher education institutions in third countries.

The Erasmus Mundus programme is being implemented as of the academic year 2004/2005.

Beyond 2006...

A new generation of programmes in the education, youth, culture and audiovisual fields will succeed the current programmes for the period 2007-2013 and will be a step towards achieving the Lisbon objective, i.e. making Europe the most competitive knowledge-based economy by 2010.

This new generation will consist of:

- a new Integrated Programme for mobility and co-operation in lifelong learning for the EU Member States, the EEA/EFTA countries and the candidate countries, covering education and training together; and
- a new Tempus Plus programme for cooperation between Member States and countries bordering the Union and the existing Tempus countries, covering the whole spectrum of education and training.

The Integrated Programme for lifelong learning would see a very significant increase in decentralised mobility actions for individual citizens and in partnerships between institutions. Its targets would include:

- At least 10% of school pupils and teachers involved in Comenius 2007-13.
- At least 3 million Erasmus students by 2010.
- At least 150,000 Leonardo trainee placements per year by 2013.
- At least 50,000 adults learning and teaching abroad per year by 2013 and the participation of at least one in five structured adult education providers in European cooperation by the end of the programme.

The Integrated Programme will be divided into four sectoral programmes: Comenius for school education; Erasmus for all forms of learning at university level; Leonardo da Vinci for initial and continuing vocational education and training; and Grundtvig for adult education. It will also contain a transversal programme, focusing on policy development, language learning, new information and communication technologies (ICT), and dissemination. The Integrated Programme will also include a new Jean Monnet programme, focusing on European integration.

The new Tempus Plus programme will build on the successful Tempus approach, which has hitherto been limited to higher education and has led to system development and reinforced cooperation between Member States and partner countries. Tempus Plus would extend such action across the spectrum of lifelong learning: to schools, to vocational education and training, and to adult education. The programme will consist of measures to support system modernisation, to fund the mobility of individuals, and to support multilateral projects. The programme target would be:

- To support the mobility of at least 100,000 individuals by 2013.
